

APPENDIX F  
GLOSSARY

F-1 ALL STOCKS. Refers to all lots, unless limited in the Narrative/Remarks column. (When this entry appears for an item, it is in addition to any restrictions placed on specific lots of that item).

F-2 AMMUNITION. All types of non-nuclear explosive ordnance, explosive material and other directly related material such as containers and production components.

F-3 DODIC/NALC (Department of Defense Identification Code/Navy Ammunition Logistics Code). These four alpha-numeric/numeric codes are listed in p-803 (TW010-AA-ORD-010) and used for the logistic control of ammunition.

F-4 LIMITED USE. Ammunition suitable for or restricted from a specific use.

F-5 MIF (Malfunction Investigation File) Number. A reference number used to identify a malfunction investigation. Once assigned by the Army (A-81-83), the number is used in all correspondence concerning the particular malfunction and to identify shipments of material related thereto.

F-6 OVERHEAD FIRE. Ammunition which is either CLEARED (will go the distance) or NOT CLEARED (will fall short of the target) to fire over troops heads.

F-7 RECLASSIFICATION. Reclassification is an action changing the Material Condition Code of ammunition. Reclassification action may emanate from any of the offices listed in the forward, but will usually take the form of a NAR or change to P-801 (TW024-AA-ORD-010).

F-8 RELEASED. The ammunition has been returned to a serviceable condition, normally Condition Code A.

F-9 SMALL ARMS AMMUNITION. Ammunition for use in small arms, i.e., all ammunition up to and including 20 millimeter.

F-10 SUSPENDED. Ammunition not suitable for issue or use pending final reclassification.

F-11 UNSERVICEABLE. Ammunition not suitable for issue or use.
